Russia's (Non-)Policy of Neighborhood: Competing Approaches

The lecture discusses the discrepancy between the concepts of a 'Russian world' and Eurasianism. They constitute a major controversy embedded in Russian integrationist policy towards its 'near abroad'. The distinction between the two concepts is substantial: the 'Russian world' is a biopolitical doctrine premised on protecting an imagined trans-territorial community of Russian speakers allegedly sharing a common macroidentity, while Eurasianism is a set of geopolitical ideas focused on governing territories rather than articulating identity discourses.
